ORIGINS OF THE DIBBLE FAMILY IN ENGLAND

[transcript of letter sent to VanBuren Lamb, Jr. by Ceilia & John Dibblee Warwickshire United Kingdom]

POSITIVE EVIDENCE Robert Dibble [Deeble] lived at Glastonbury, Somerset, at least between 1605 and February 1610, when his son John 1605, and daughters Joanna (April 1609) and Francis (February 1610) were baptized at the church of St. John Baptist. It is likely that he moved shortly after the last event because there is no record of his son Thomas' baptism anywhere, and Thomas (calculating from his age at emigration) must have been born in 1612 or 1613. The fact that we have the right family is proved because Francis' age at emigration tallies with her baptismal date. The probability is that Thomas was baptized elsewhere after the family moved, but the record has not survived. It would have been likely to have survived at Glastonbury, where the records were carefully kept, unless his father, perhaps for religious reasons, avoided having him baptized. Most parents started their families shortly after marriage but as neither Robert's marriage nor the baptism of earlier children is recorded at Glastonbury, it is fair guess he moved there shortly before 1605.

There is no evidence of the family elsewhere in England before or after this until, Robert, probably with some of his family, emigrated from Weymouth, Dorset, to New England in the "Recovery of London" (Master, Gabriel Cornish) on 31st, March 1633 to be followed by Thomas and Francis from the same port on 20th March 1635.

BACKGROUND

The county of Somerset was highly populated in the 16th/17th centuries. There were a number of families with the name "Dibble", or of a similar spelling, well distributed over it and in neighboring Devon and the east of Cornwall as well. The name "Robert" and "Thomas" were common among them. Spelling was quite arbitrary, and surnames were apt to be written down as what the writer thought he heard, the owner of the name being either indifferent to it or illiterate. In this case anything containing a "D", a "b" and an "l" could be what we were looking for, but there is no reason to suppose that any groups or similar name were necessarily related.

Unless an individual was a prominent person or a criminal, the only mark he was likely to leave for posterity was the (supposedly compulsory) record of his baptism, marriage and burial kept in a register by the incumbent of the local parish church, or his clerk. Some only of these records survive. In Somerset there are a very large number of parishes, about half of which have registers starting in later than the dates we are interested in or have gaps. It was an age of successive outbreaks of plague, to be followed in a short time by civil war, iconoclasm and sackings of clergy, and records suffered. It is very rare indeed to be able to follow any individual through Baptism, Marriage and Burial in the registers, and impossible to be sure that, say, a baptism, followed by a marriage of someone of the same name about 20 years

later, refers to the same person.

So we don't know who were the parents of our Robert Dibble, where he was born or married or if he had fathered any children before John. After searching through most of the likely parishes in Somerset, Devon and Cornwall (Dorset seems void of Dibbles) we haven't found a really likely candidate who might be Robert Dibble.

As there were plenty of Dibbles around in the West Country (and still are) one can presume the stock had been there for some time and were much more likely to have been descended from Saxons than from French immigrants (as some have supposed).

Attorney: graduate of Yale University. May 1774: he affirmed his loyalty to British institutions Captain of 1st Stamford Company, 9th Connecticut Regiment. Called to account by General Assembly of Connecticut - the charge that "did endeavour to prevent the introduction of certain barrels of gunpowder into the colony". Also charged with having drawn up a paper disapproving of rebellion against the mother country, to which a number of Loyalists had affixed their signatures. Arrived on ship "Union" River St. John, New Brunswick. Came to Kingston in 1783. His allotment of land is now called Palmer point. This point had been a French Settlement before the invasion of the St. John River by General Monckton when he burnt four buildings at this site.

The case of Filer DIBBLEE and his family set to the Subscriber.
Filer DIBBLEE Esq. was the eldest son of the Rev. Ebenezer DIBBLEE, Rector of the Episcopal Church at Stamford in the Colony of Connecticut, who gave him liberal Education and settled him in Stamford where he practised the Law. He became eminent in his profession and some years previous to the Rebellion was appointed representative to the General Assembly for the Town of Stamford. From the first appearance of the American Rebellion, he took a decided part in favor of the King and British Government and prevailed over the Malcontents of that Town till 1776 at great hazard to his life. He then was overpowered by mobs from neighbouring Towns, and after much abuse was compelled in August 1776 to make his escape and took shelter under the British Standard in Long Island. The Rebels, in the beginning of 1777, turned his Wife and 5 children naked into the Street, plundered his house of all its effects and took even the Childrens' Hats from their Heads and shoes from their feet; they sent them stripped under a flag of truce to New York and confiscated his property.

Mr. DIBBLEE revived his Naked Family and obtained credit sufficient to Clothe and support them and settled them at Oyster Bay on Long Island but in 1778 a party of Rebels plundered and stripped his Family a second time of all their wearing apparel and effects, and carried

Mr. DIBBLEE Prisoner to the interior parts of Connecticut; and after six months confinement, he was exchanged .
On returning to his Family whom he found in great distress, he applied to his friends for farther Credit and again clothed and settled them at Westhills on Long Island, where in 1779 his house was invisted by a Party of Rebels who confined his wife and children (Mr. DIBBLEE being from home) and threatened to put them to the Bayonet in case them made any noise, whilst others stripped them and the House of their effects and Mrs. DIBBLEE and her six children were left the 3rd time by the Rebels to Perish in the cold.

Mr. DIBBLEE removed his family andmoved them to Himpstead South on Long Island and again clothed and provided for them on farther credit from his Friends but in 1780 another party of Rebels surrounded his House in the Night and stripped him, his family and house the 4th time of their effects.

Mr. DIBBLEE then for the first time made application to the Commander in Chief for relief and obtained a small sum not exceeding 100 Dollars; and in 1783 moved north his Family to St. Johns River in New Brunswick where he settled himself and Family in a Logg House about 30 miles up the said River, and spent the following Winter in great want and misery.

In the Winter of 1784, Mr. DIBBLEE's fortitude gave way by looking back on the Chain of misfortunes that had befallen his Family, and the dreary prospects arising from the Climate, Soil and his debts and he concluded that he must go to Goal for his Debts and there die; whilst his Family would inevitably starve and Perish

The Result was that Mr. DIBBLEE grew Melancholy and which soon deprived him of his Reason, and for four months could not be left by himself; and in the Month of March 1784, whilst the family were at Tea Mr. DIBBLEE walked back and forth in the Room seemingly much composed but unobserved he took a Razor from the Closet, threw himself on the Bed, drew the Curtains and cut his own throat.
Here ended not the Calamaties of Mrs. DIBBLEE and his Family for soon after the death of Mr. DIBBLEE, her House accidentally took fire and was burnt to the Ground, with the goods and effects.

She with great difficulty built another Hut, which in the same year was set on fire by an Indian

Servant Girl, and burnt to ashes. She and her children again built themselves a Logg Hut where they are in extreme want and in prospect of spending their lives in perfect penury, unless, aided by Government, as they have no friends able to help them.

Decd. previous to the America War, that he was Uniformly Loyal and with firmness supported the British Government as a Gentleman of great consequence in Stamford, was representative of that Town and a Lawyer of good representation of income, that he was overpowered by rebellious mobs and was obliged to escape to Long Island for personal safety, whilst his family were plundered of his effects - That he was afterwards made prisoner by the Rebels and his Family often Plundered whilst at Long Island That, in Last October I was at the miserable habitation of Mrs. DIBBLEE the relict of said Filer DIBBLEE on the Bank of the River St. John in New Brunswick, and found .. and her helpless children in a Log Hutt the ground was its Floor with the fire in the centre of the room surrounded by the Family instead of a Chimney, it exhibited the Scene of absolute Poverty and Distress. Mrs. DIBBLEE told me that she often time had not so much as Potatoes to supply herself and family That her necessities were brought on them by the untimely death of Mr. DIBBLEE and from two Fires which had burnt her House and moveables That her prospects were frightful in that Cold Country and that she was not able to make her Hut comfortable against the approaching winter and that she had no Friends able to assist her with food and Cloaths.

The youngest child of the Dibblee family, who must have lived on the old farm at Woodstock when he was a little boy, was Ebenezer, who was the ancestor of William Fyler Dibblee, a very well-known man in Woodstock, who, curiously enough, was a cousin of my wife's mother, whose maiden name was Mary Secord. He was a great friend of my father and also of myself. He was a man who possessed a marvellous memory. As an illustration of this, I recall a case in which a prominent lumberman named MOORE closed the road in the town of Woodstock leading down the north bank of the Mexnakik to the old Beardsley Mill. This deprived a good many people of a near entrance to their buildings. They took legal action against Mooers and in the trial a number of the "old inhabitants" were called to prove that the street had been so many years in use as a public street that it could not lawfully be closed. No witness was so ready and positive in his replies as William Fyler Dibblee, who could give date and date for things in a manner that was very damaging to Mooers' interest. Mr. Gregory (afterwards Judge Gregory a very able lawyer) paused in his questioning and regarding the witness for a while said very seriously "Pardon me, Mr. Dibblee, May I ask how old a man you are?" If I remember right, he said, "I am ninety years old." Mr. Gregory said, "Mr. Dibblee, that is a wonderful age." "It is," said he, "I'm thankful to have been spared so long." Mr. Gregory paused

again and then said very impressively, "Mr. Dibblee, are you aware that when a man reaches that age his faculties naturally fail him; his memory is not to be relied upon as in his younger days; I don't think Mr. Dibblee if I were ninety years old I could stand up and swear as you have done the date and day in your evidence." Everybody was on the qui vive for the answer, and it came instantaneously, "Very likely you couldn't remember Mr. Gregory, but then you and I are of a different breed!" The spectators laughed, the jury laughed, the judge laughed and even Mr. Gregory laughed, and Mooers lost his case. Mr. Dibblee I think attained the age of 94 years and died of injuries received in falling down the

cellar stairs. Dr. Rankin, a clever Woodstock physican, told me that when past ninety years, Mr. Dibblee's heart action, arteries etc. were like those of a man almost in the prime of life. The doctor regarded him as easily a centenarian and deplored that the opportunity of making a record for longevity in Woodstock should have been spoiled by so simple a thing as falling down the cellar stairs.

In his younger days, William F. Dibblee had an unusual head of brilliant red hair, which made him decidedly conspicuous, particularly when travelling, but when he grew white with years, the transformation was wonderful and he was quite a distinguished looking man. He was a strict teetotaler and would not touch liquor in any form but he once told my father that he loved the taste of it, and that there were times when he found it necessary to go to the woods on a fishing excursion or something of that sort to get out of the way of temptation. It seemed like a disease he said, these periodic spells in which he would give almost anything in the world for a

dring. His iron will and God's help saved him.

To the last he retained and used to show with pride the "Manifesto of the Good Ship Union" in which his grandfather, Fyler Dibblee brought more than 200 Loyalists to the River St. John in May 1783. He was a very active Freemason and loved the ritual of the Order, although in churchmanship he was a decided Evangelical, and disliked ritualism. He and my father were for years churchwardens in Woodstock. They were also actively interested in the old-time Militia, and I remember them as mounted officers at the annual training, or "General Muster" of the militia I can recall the old fashioned field officers' uniforms, with epaulettes and long tailed blue coats with bright brass buttons. I remember well one "training day" on the Faymond and peabody Intervales, about 55 years ago. At the close of the day's training, the Colonel of the First Battalion of Carleton County Militia, Col. William T. Baird made a short speech and called for "three cheers for the Queen." Then somebody else called for "three cheers for Colonel Baird" and then "three cheers for Major Raymond" and "three cheers for Adjutant Dibblee" whereat father's old mare "Gill" became excited and waltzed round a little.

Frank married Coral and had three children named Colin, Pauline and Lynn. Pauline lives in Wivelsfield Green Sussex, but I don't know where the others are. In fact the cousins are all over the place from South Africa, New Zealand and Canada (I expect they would be very interested in the family tree's Canadian connection). I have just borrowed a book from the Gloucester Family History Resource Centre on names and occupations and it says a dibble was a name for a farm worker, so that may be the derivation of the surname Dibblee as I think someone added an extra 'e' somewhere along the line.

I have visited your Web page and you seem to have been very busy researching your family connections.

Church, Stamford, Conn., fifty-one years, came to Pine Plains 1784. he had been from 1776 to 1781 in business in Sharon, Conn., moved from thence to Salisbury in 1782, to Pine Plains in 1784, then North East Precinct, opened a store in the log house then standing west of Pine Plains corners, on the site of the now Albert Bowman residence, and lived in part of the same house. Augustus Bates, a relative, was for several years a clerk. In 1788 North East Precinct became North East Town, and Mr. Dibblee was elected town clerk, and re-elected four years. In 1793 was Supervisor, in 1795 and 1796 town clerk, and supervisor in 1797 and 1798. Meantime he continued merchandising, and in 1801 his second son Fyler, then twenty-one, became a partner under the firm name Ebenezer Dibblee & Son. July 1, 1803, they purchased the present Ketterer Hotel property of Dr. Asahel Haskins. The bounds of this purchase is south from the corner to Mr. Frank Eno's law office, then easterly about fifteen rods, then northerly on the west line of now Peter Wolven dwelling to Church Street, containing "three acres, one rood and eighteen purchases." This land was a portion of six acres which Haskins that day had bought of Wm. Cromwell. The remainder of the six acres joined this to the east on Church Street. In the spring of 1804, E. Dibblee & Son. Fyler Dibblee being the active man, commenced building the hotel Ketterer on the corner, Ezra L. Barrett, the boss carpenter, taking the contract. The building was completed that year, the painting, not being included in the contract, being done in December 1804 and January 1805 for which Mr. Barrett makes this entry: "To 36 days work at painting \$34.31. to 6 weeks boarding while painting, \$9.00." Nathaniel Ruggles was its first keeper, but the sign post, and indispensable addendum to tavers, Fyler Dibblee and his father had failed to furnish. So, from necessity, landlord Ruggles had to supply this deficiency which he did in a wise and becoming manner by permitting "Boss" Barrett to give the final stroke. For this merited honor he records this modest charge against landlord Ruggles, "Hewing sign post 6s," and if the chroniclers of that time have recorded the height of this sign post, when set, and what sort of a board and name landlord Ruggles placed upon its top, the record nor tradition has not come under our eyes nor into our ears. The next year, 1805, Ebenezer Dibblee and Fyler his son built the "Sostwick store," now Chase store, under the supervision of Mr. Barrett the carpenter. He worked upon it all the year and finished it after E. Dibblee & Son had moved into it in the fall of that year. It was completed January 1806, and Mr. Barrett's bill was \$599.28 1/2.

In February, 1808, Fyler Dibblee purchased the now Walter T. Myers house and store lot of Peter Husted for \$319.50, and in that year built the brick dwelling thereon, the only brick house in the village. Mr. Barrett did the carpenter work which is still in good condition. In this year, 1808, Ebenezer Dibblee retired from the business firm, and Fyler continued the business alone until 1816, when Reuben W. Bostwick, who had been in his employ as clerk since about 1812-except the year 1815 in Albany-became a partner under the firm "Flyer Dibblee & Co." The next year, 1817, the Red Hook store was started. Fyler Dibblee retired from the mercantile business in 1822 and moved to the Thompson farm "consisting of 810 acres," now C. C. More, about two miles southwest of the village. In January 1825 a notice appears in a Pokeepsie paper that the greater part of the farm will be sold at auction on the 17th of February next at the court house in Pokeepsie. Financial embarrassment was the cause. The farm was sold, and Mr. Dibblee moved to New York and opened an office No. 50 Wall Street for commission business. Two years later, June 11, 1827, he announced that David Z. Wickes was his partner, their office being "at the Railway of the New York Dry Dock Company

on the eastern side of the city." he deceased July 13, 1841. He married a daughter of Dr. Wilson, of Clermont, and some of his children were born in the brick dwelling, now W. T. Myers, one of whom William W., of New Jersey, was living two years since at the age of 86. During his residence in Pine Plains he was a prominent citizen in every regard, and favorably and honorably known through out this county and Southern Columbia. he served the town as its clerk first in 1803 and '4, again in 1811 and as Supervisor in 1818 and '19, and in July 1818 was appointed judge of the court of common pleas in this county, having for his associates Daniel C. Ver Pland, Albro Akin and Maturin Liningston. Upon his retirement from the mercantile business in 1822 R. W. Bostwick and Brothers purchased the stock and assumed the liabilities of the firm. It was a heavy indebtedness, but the prudence and wisdom of R. W. Bostwick, principally, the others retiring, disposed of all liabilities in a few years. Ebenezer Dibblee, after his retirement from merchandising, devoted his energies to farming on the lands of George Clark, on which the log house stood, until his decease Feb. 13, 1826, aged 81. His wife, Esther Harvey, deceased July 17, 1843. They were married by his father, Rev. Ebenezer Dibblee, at the residence of Joel Harvey his wife's father, in Sharon, Conn., Nov. 14, 1776, who lived in the brick house (More-house) on the flat between Sharon and Amenia. March 17, 1827, Sally, his only surviving sister, deceased at Catskill, in her 71st year. Sally, a daughter, deceased at Pine Plains Sept. 10, 1821, aged 37. His children were Henry, Fyler, Rhuama Smith, born in Sharon, Conn.; Frederick, born in Salisbury, Conn; Sally, Caty, Richard Harvery, Harriet, Eliza, Maria Ester, Edward Ebenezer, Cornelia Henrietta, Julia Amelia Ann, born in Pine Plains. Harriet married jacob Van Ness of Red Hook. She deceased 1813, and he married 2d Rhuama Smith, (widow Stevenson,) who deceased 1852. Cornelia married Aaron C. Hall, of Catskill, and have descendants in New Haven. Caty, or Catharine, married Egbert Thompson, son of Ezra Thompson, of Federal Square, who with his brother-in-law Edward Ebenezer Dibblee continuing the business there until 1821, and perhaps later. Henry married a Miss Reed of Coxsackie. Fyler and Richard married sister, daughters of Dr. Wilson, of Clermont. Ebenezer Dibblee was an Episcopal churchman, and retained his connection with the church in Sharon, Conn., which had received its first ministrations from his father, and of which his father-in-law, Mr. Joel Harvey, was a leading churchman. But during the Revolutionary war the church there was used as a barrack, and never used afterward for worship. In 1809 the present Episcopal society there was organized, and in 1812 Ebenezer Dibblee, then a resident of Pine Plains (as now organized), in conjunction with Reuben Warner of New Milford and Moses Seymour of Litchfield, was chosen to select a site for the church building in Sharon, and the Episcopal church stands upon the site. A little later, 1815, the "Union Meeting House" of Pine Plains was built, in which through the influence of the Deeblee family the Episcopalians had a recognized right. He may very properly be called the founder of the Episcopal church in Pine Plains. mr. Ebenezer Dibblee deceased February 13, 1826, as hereinbefore noticed, and March 14th following his real and personal effects were sold at public vendue. These included the lease of the farm west of the village where he lived, then containing one hundred and thirty acres, the site of the now Albert Bowman residence, four wood lots of fifteen acres each, thirty-eight acres of land, "principally grass land," and the "equal undivided half of the hotel, store house, shops, outbuildings and building lots," which comprised the hotel corner property which he and his son Fyler bought as partners in 1803. [Note-Reuben W. Bostwick had become the owner of Fyler Dibblee's half interest of Ebenezer Dibblee to the store property, now

Chase store.] At the same time was sold "all the furniture, household utensils, milch cows, young cattle, working horses and colts, hogs, grain on the ground, stacks of hay, farming utensils, &c., of the late Ebenezer Dibblee, deceased. The sale will commence at 9 o'clock in the morning, and a liberal credit given for good security." A few of the household articles sold at this time are to be found in some dwellings in the town now. This sale was the end of all things animate or inanimate pertaining to the family of Ebenezer Dibblee in Pine Plains.
